

COMMON PROWORDS

Proword	Explanation
• This Is	This transmission is from the station whose designator immediately follows
• Over	This is the end of my transmission to you and a response is necessary. Go ahead, transmit
• Break (BT)	I hereby indicate the separation of the text from other portions of the
• Speak Slower	Your transmission is too fast. Reduce speed of transmission
• Correction	An error has been made in this transmission. Transmission will continue with the last word correctly transmitted. An error has been made in this transmission (or message indicated). The correct version is..... That which follows is a corrected version in answer to your request for verification
• Word-Before / Word-After	The word of the message to which I have reference is that which precedes..... The word of the message to which I have reference is that which follows.....
• I Spell	I shall spell the next word phonetically
• Say Again	Repeat all of your last transmission. Followed by identification data means "Repeat..... (portion indicated)."
• I Say Again	I am repeating transmission or portion indicated.
• Figures (Not Used In ARRL)	Numerals or numbers follow
• Roger	This is a method of receipt. I have received your last transmission satisfactorily.
• Out	This is the end of my transmission to you and no answer is required or expected.
• Affirmative	Yes
• Nothing Heard	To be used when no reply is received from a call station
• More To Follow	Transmitting station has additional traffic for the receiving station.
• Relay To	Transmit this message to all addressees (or addressees immediately following this proword). The address component is mandatory when this proword is used
• Send Your	I am ready to receive your message, report, etc. (Used only in reply to the offer of a message, etc., on K
• Wait	I must pause for a few seconds
• Wait-Out	I must pause for longer than a few seconds.
