This network and team will exercise on a regular basis to conduct training of appropriately licensed Amateur Radio operators, and to educate the medical community and other user groups and agencies on utilization of Amateur Radio during emergency situations.

The **Medical Services Team** provides trained, competent radio operators to every hospital emergency department, public health, and health care affiliated agency in western Washington state, able to respond when disaster strikes. The team is supported by technical staff and logistics organization. The team is engaged in a program to provide permanent voice and digital capability in hospitals and around the region, enabling them to communicate with each other, medical suppliers, Emergency Operations Centers and other public service agencies when necessary.

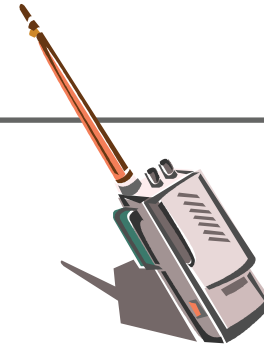
Supporting the Health Care System

When the power is on, and the phones are working, and everything works routinely, our services won't be needed. BUT when things go boom, crackle, pop, or a major disaster occurs, the **Medical Services Communications Teams** can provide **vital backup communications** for hospitals, blood banks, medical suppliers, public health, and field support for a mass casualty incident (MCI).

If normal communications are disrupted, Amateur Radio operators of the Medical Services teams can provide the **communication** links between healthcare agencies and emergency operations centers; between public health and hospitals; and between hospitals and their supply lines.



When we do our job, **Communications**, then health care providers can continue with theirs—providing care to the sick and injured.
